# **Denis Kent**

Internationally acclaimed Central Otago artist Denis Kent celebrated his 80th birthday in 2020. In September and October of that year, Central Stories Museum and Art Gallery in Alexandra displayed an exhibition, a retrospective of his art works from 1968 to 2020. The pieces, on loan from private ownership and the artist's collection, had never been seen together.

Denis started painting while at school in Dunedin and has never stopped. His prolific career has been recognised with a range of awards including life membership of the Central Otago Art Society. He has exhibited at each of the Central Otago Art Society Blossom Festival shows.

Specialising in realist landscapes and often depicting images referring to fishing and hunting, Denis' works encourage the viewer to imagine themselves within the atmospheric scenes. While he has painted many other locations, Denis has a special relationship with Central Otago and in particular Mt Aspiring National Park.


## Shotover Landscape 1970
